But I also feel stressed, somewhat anxious. Recently I read a blog post written by Rev. Jenny Smith, a pastor in Washington, who compared ministry over the past 16 months with running a marathon. We closed our doors to in-person worship.

We figured out online worship. Maybe. Kind of.

We tried to continue as many ministries as we could sustain.

We dreamed up new ones.

We crashed and burned.

We spent hours looking at blank screens summoning sermons to write themselves.

We spoke hope and grace and possibility.

We agonized over the safest ways to return to in-person gatherings.

We received grace and stunning kindness from people in our communities.

She then said that, with reopening, we don't cross the finish line. Instead, a 2<sup>nd</sup> marathon begins. Because injustice continues.

This resonates with me – the soul fatigue. Yes, I am tired. I feel uninspired. I have difficulty focusing on a single thought.

I know that I am not alone. Many of you have similar experiences, similar weariness. Rev. Jenny suggests slowing down, stopping the race, the frenzy of competition, the unending rush to do it all.

Resting when it's time to rest.

Saying yes to a new idea when it glistens with possibility.

Saying no when something feels too heavy.

Asking new questions in places we assumed the old answer.

Breathing deeply of God's grace and love and restoration.

Along with the fatigue, I feel energized by the ways the Spirit is blowing among us. I am excited by some of the new things that are happening. Perhaps we don't have to run. Maybe we can pause to breathe in the questions and new ways of being church together. Will you walk with me?

# An Update on COVID-19

We have not yet reached the end of the pandemic. As of July 6, 60% of all Californians aged 12+ are fully vaccinated. SLO County stands at 50.7% and North County is below that at 46.6%. The Delta variant is twice as infectious as the Alpha variant and now accounts for over half of all infections in the US and has reached SLO County. The good news is that all three vaccines are quite effective against serious illness and death — as long as you are fully vaccinated. If you have only received one shot (of Pfizer or Moderna), you need to obtain the second shot to be fully protected.

Unfortunately, it is still possible for even fully vaccinated people to become infected with the virus (whether or not they are symptomatic) and transmit it to others. Therefore masks continue to be required for many in-person gatherings including medical offices, banks, and now, the State Capitol. As of Wed, July 7, a mask mandate has been reinstated for all legislators and Capitol staff, regardless of vaccine status. This is after 9 people, 4 of whom were fully vaccinated, tested positive for the coronavirus.

Encourage everyone you know to be vaccinated, if they are eligible age- and health-wise. And continue to do the things that reduce your risk of contracting or sharing the virus.

# **Re-opening Plans**

Most of us are eager to be physically together again as a church community. It seems like everything is opening up around us, but we're still on Zoom. We are aiming for a reopening date in early September.

As Community Church moves closer to reopening, we are trying to be very thoughtful to implement the best practices that will keep people as safe as possible. We are considering those who have been fully vaccinated and those who have not, individuals whose immune systems are weaker or compromised, and children under age 12 who are not eligible for getting the vaccine. We have to incorporate recommendations from our insurance company so that we can be financially as safe as possible. And as a faith community we recognize that how we can best love our neighbor continues to guide our decision-making.

Another factor in when we can reopen is that renovations are happening in the church basement, which affect bathroom access. Hopefully that will be completed by early-mid August.

#### **KEEPING CONNECTED**

Many within our congregation do not use email or have access to online communication. We have set up a system for communication where someone with email is matched with a non-email person and telephone them to share information. **General Synod 33 is here!** Every 2 years the United Church of Christ gathers as the General Synod to discern the Spirit's calling to the church in this present day. This year we gather across the country (and the world) virtually.

For registered participants, there are 50 diverse workshops already available to attend "on demand." An interactive exhibit hall will be open during the week of Synod. Delegates will be conducting the business of the Church.

And there will be 3 worship services open to everyone and not requiring registration: 2 pm Sunday, July 11; 5 pm Wednesday, July 14; and 3 pm Sunday, July 18. These will be streamed live on the UCC YouTube and Facebook channels as well as on www.generalsynod.org.

  - d) Enter a credit card or bank account to link to the app
  - e) You have the option to cover the fees: \$.30 for the transaction plus either 1.0% for a bank transfer or 2.9% for credit card.
  - f) Click "Give" and you have now successfully given to Community Church! (Oh, and you have the option to set up recurring giving.)
