As I Ponder...

Technically I am old enough to remember the end of the Vietnam War. But I don't. I do, however, remember people telling of that final exit and of people who were also trying to escape. It may (or may not) be the same as the US departure from Kabul; I don't know. I don't know what the horrors of war really are. But I do know people who fled Vietnam, who risked their lives under cover of darkness, setting off in a small boat. During their time at sea they were raided by pirates, their food and few possessions stolen. When they approached shores of safety, they were shot at. Years in a refugee camp did not dim their appreciation for a new home in the U.S.

I cannot know what it has been like for people in Kabul and other parts of Afghanistan, either over the past 20 years or the past 2 months. I imagine there has been fear, pain, loss, grief, perhaps some occasional hope, and hopes dashed. In the midst of war, people have still lived lives – births and deaths, school and careers, food, music, and community. It is also clear from news reports that many bonds were formed between Americans serving there and Afghans who worked with them.

We are inextricably linked – us and Afghans, us and Vietnamese. We have connections and shared history that mean the future ties us together. As the refugees arrive to our shores, I hope we welcome them with grace and tenderness, knowing they bring with them a tremendous grief. I hope we rise to the opportunity to embrace and support them, to be humble in our inability to help them be safe in their own land. But I fear we will keep repeating the past, that there will be some who embrace and some who hate, that those who have lost everything will be blamed for their loss and accused of causing us discomfort.

Ancient scriptures command us to love our neighbor and welcome the stranger. A gift to our young nation proclaims, *Give me your tired, your poor...* Yet still we wonder what we should do.

The Growing Our Community Campaign

Community Church of Atascadero is deeply woven into the Atascadero Community. Our roots lead back to community worship under a tree in Stadium Park. Our members are actively engaged across the city and our campus serves as a location for elections, support groups, concerts, the winter emergency shelter, meetings, and education. Our facilities, however, have been in need of maintenance and renovation for several years.

In order to continue in our mission of extravagant welcome to the Atascadero community, CCA has embarked on a renovation project that will result in an updated and safer central location for our many church activities as well as for community events. Among the renovations are new roofing of our sanctuary building, new flooring

for meeting rooms/classrooms in both the sanctuary building and in the adjacent Hewitt building, sidewalk replacement, creating an accessible restroom in our Fellowship Hall, and repainting many areas of the church campus.

Our Growing our Community Campaign seeks to raise \$200,000 to cover the cost of repairs, improvements, renovations, updates, and safety features. Over \$97,000 has already been raised for these projects; now we are asking members and friends to help us complete this important project. Of course, we welcome direct financial donations. In addition, we are planning several fund-raising events and opportunities. Donations of time and talent may also be appropriate for some projects.

The needs range from the small – paint a room – to the large – paint the sanctuary exterior! They include replacing the broken sidewalks that had become a fall hazard, adding bannisters where needed, and resurfacing the parking lots. Re-roofing our sanctuary has been completed and we now move on towards creating a handicap-accessible bathroom in Fellowship Hall, painting the exterior of the Sanctuary, and completing the repainting of Fellowship Hall. Already, the Hewitt Building boasts new flooring and newly painted rooms while the Sanctuary basement has changed from dingy to welcoming.

Community Church is a safe, inclusive location that fills a unique purpose in Atascadero. Please join us in building on our history of welcoming and support as we continue Growing our Community.

COVID-19 and Re-opening

We are still working toward a hybrid of online worship with a safe, in-person experience. But the current state of the pandemic locally has increased the emphasis on establishing safe procedures. Almost all cases in SLO County are the Delta variant, which is apparently twice as infectious as previous strains. ICUs locally are being overwhelmed. The heavy toll of COVID-19 on the hospital system is exhausting medical personnel and means other health needs are also impacted. The best defense against the virus is to be vaccinated. Unfortunately, while this will reduce the seriousness of the illness, it does not mean we cannot still become infected. People who have been fully vaccinated can still contract the virus. Anecdotally, to be vaccinated and have a breakthrough infection may feel like being hit by a truck! It is also possible to be symptom-free, unknowingly transmitting the virus to others including unvaccinated children.

All of this means it is essential to keep doing the other protective measures like wearing a mask when indoors with other people outside your "pod," maintaining physical distance, compulsively washing your hands after being out somewhere, and, as hard as it is, to refrain from hugs.

This brings challenges to indoor worship. But we will keep moving ahead toward providing worship opportunities with some strong protocols. Thank you for your patience as we continue to figure out the best and safest path.
